#### What's New?

<sup>5</sup>And the one who was seated on the throne said, "See, I am making all things new." (Revelation 21:5)

<sup>17</sup>So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new! (2 Corinthians 5:17)

So what is new?

It is 2018 and once again we stand at the beginning of a new year. Perhaps some have made resolutions to change a form of behavior, or habit, or attitude. Perhaps some are starting a new chapter in their life. Perhaps the days ahead look like the same old same old, going through the routine without much hope for anything new at all.

Paul in his letter to those in Corinth speaks about a whole new way of living. It is so new that one cannot even recognize the old, it has all passed away, it is as if it was dead.

John in his witness of faith in the experience of real life, places the certainty of God's activity in providing for a new life, at the heart of his revelation.

Life at times sucks. It is filled with pain and sorrow, uncertainty and despair. Life is hard. That is not new at all. That still awaits us all in this new year. No matter how much we huff and puff we cannot blow down the walls that close us in.

But God promises something new! A new life. A new way of living. A life risen from the dead. Now!

We have been assured of this through the birth of Jesus and we have been promised this through our Baptism into the death and resurrection of Jesus.

In fact, we have been baptized into a new way of living. One that is not dependent upon our accomplishments, our successes, our status, or our efforts. This new life is given to us. It is a gift.

The gift of Jesus opens up the possibility of our new life as we enter this new year. Paul declares this over and over again in his letters.

<sup>1</sup>I therefore, the prisoner in the Lord, beg you to lead a life worthy of the calling to which you have been called, <sup>2</sup>with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, <sup>3</sup>making every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. <sup>4</sup>There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling, <sup>5</sup>one Lord, one faith, one baptism, <sup>6</sup>one God and Father of all, who is above all and through all and in all.

<sup>7</sup>But each of us was given grace according to the measure of Christ's gift
<sup>17</sup>Now this I affirm and insist on in the Lord: you must no longer live as the Gentiles live, in the futility of their minds. <sup>18</sup>They are darkened in their understanding, alienated from

the life of God because of their ignorance and hardness of heart. 19They have lost all sensitivity and have abandoned themselves to licentiousness, greedy to practice every kind of impurity. 20That is not the way you learned Christ! 21For surely you have heard about him and were taught in him, as truth is in Jesus. <sup>22</sup>You were taught to put away your former way of life, your old self, corrupt and deluded by its lusts, 23 and to be renewed in the spirit of your minds, 24 and to clothe yourselves with the new self, created according to the likeness of God in true righteousness and holiness. <sup>25</sup>So then, putting away falsehood, let all of us speak the truth to our neighbors, for we are members of one another. 26Be angry but do not sin; do not let the sun go down on your anger, 27 and do not make room for the devil. 28 Thieves must give up stealing; rather let them labor and work honestly with their own hands, so as to have something to share with the needy. 29Let no evil talk come out of your mouths, but only what is useful for building up, as there is need, so that your words may give grace to those who hear. 30 And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, with which you were marked with a seal for the day of redemption. 31Put away from you all bitterness and wrath and anger and wrangling and slander, together with all malice, 32 and be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ has forgiven you. <sup>1</sup>Therefore be imitators of God, as beloved children, <sup>2</sup>and live in love, as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us, a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God. (Ephesians 4:1-7; 17-5:2)

What new way of living will you be open to this year? What new way of connecting with Christ will you focus on this year? How will you hear God's call for you to live out your new life in Christ? Who will help you?

These questions I lay on all of our hearts so that we can be a stronger community of faith which bears witness to the love of Jesus which transforms our lives each new day.

# Wednesday Home Bible Study Psalm 46

<sup>1</sup>God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. <sup>2</sup>Therefore we will not fear, though the earth should change, though the mountains shake in the heart of the sea; <sup>3</sup>though its waters roar and foam, though the mountains tremble with its tumult. <sup>4</sup>There is a river whose streams make glad the city of God, the holy habitation of the Most High. <sup>5</sup>God is in the midst of the city; it shall not be moved; God will help it when the morning dawns. <sup>6</sup>The nations are in an uproar, the kingdoms totter; he utters his voice, the earth melts. <sup>7</sup>The LORD of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our refuge. <sup>8</sup>Come, behold the works of the LORD; see what desolations he has brought on the earth. <sup>9</sup>He makes wars cease to the end of the earth; he breaks the bow, and shatters the spear; he burns the shields with fire. 10"Be still, and know that I am God! I am exalted among the nations, I am exalted in the earth." <sup>11</sup>The LORD of hosts is with us: the God of Jacob is our refuge.

Martin Luther used this Psalm as his source of the hymn "A Mighty Fortress is our God"

Notice how the Psalm starts. Nature is imaged in this psalm providing a strong foundation of security and strength. Promises are declared and the way people do business will change. No longer will there be war. (I need to pause here to let this soak in a little. There has been too much war in my lifetime. War among nations, war within body politics, warring madness within family circles).

(pause and think about what this would be like for you not to have any more "wars".)

All this is promised in this Psalm but what stands out is where all this leads to: No more wars; our security assured, and with those distractions eliminated comes our full attention which can now say who is God.

What we discover is that our insecurity, our warring madness our despair has been caused by the fact that we have tried in so many different ways to take control, to be in control of our fate, our lives. And in so doing we have created our own hell, our own prison. We have increased our worry and anxiety.

God wants us to be at peace. God wants to bring us peace (remember Christmas). God knows our needs and wants us to stop running around in circles and to take in the truth that God is our sovereign Lord and Savior.

How can we "be still" today? What ways have you tried and how have they helped you? What does not work for you?

When was the last time you simply sat and listened to God? What keeps you from taking that time? When is the best time for you?

Try finding 10 to 20 minutes of time when you are quiet and there are no other distractions.

- Sit in a comfortable place
- Put both feet on the ground and relaxed your hands and arms.
- Close your eyes and listen.
- If your mind wonders don't fight it. Simply think of a phrase or word like "Love", or "Into your hands I place my spirit". Or "Jesus". Think those words over and over again until you go back to listening.
- Don't try to "fix" anything, or "plan "anything. Simply listen to your own breath and to God.
