Pastor's Message

October is usually known for pumpkin spice, fall festivals, and Halloween, but did you know for Lutherans, the Sunday on or before October 31st is also known as Reformation Sunday. On this day, we remember Martin Luther, who posted his 95 Theses on the door of the church in Wittenberg, Germany. This event led to the Protestant Reformation which became one of the most important defining moment in world history. Not only did Luther's reformation challenge the sale of indulgences within the church, it also changed our understanding of how we see our relationship with God. Martin Luther made it clear, we don't need a priest, a bishop, or even the pope to mediate between us and God. Through the death and resurrection of Christ, we already have a direct line to God and God has a direct line to us.

I have shared with our weekly Bible Study group that the most important lesson I learned about our Lutheran understanding of God was "justification by faith." As a child, I grew up being taught that I had to work in order to be justified by God. I had to convert non-believers so that I would have an answer for God at heaven's gate. I had to learn how to sing hymns because it was a requirement to get into heaven. I had to do this, I need to do that or I won't be good enough. I didn't fully understand "justification by faith" until I went to seminary. And, let me tell you, it was a huge weight off my shoulders. Even while I was being taught that I needed to do all these things to get into heaven, I knew that I wasn't good enough and that no matter how good I become, I would eventually fall short of the glory of God.

So you can see why "justification by faith" was such an uplifting revelation to me. It radically changed my understanding of my relationship with God. I was no longer bound to my works but I am finally free; free to love, free to care, free to be who I am called to be, for God and for my neighbor. I am happy to share my experience with you but that is not the only thing I want you to know about this October.

As you know, Reformation Sunday is special, not only because we celebrate Martin Luther and his legacy but also because it is Confirmation Sunday. On this Sunday, we have an opportunity to listen to our young folks speak about their faith. This is truly a special moment for these young people and their families but it is also a special moment for the life of the church. This is what it means to be a church, to have a space for people to gather and testify to how God is working in their lives, to see how God is creating and redeeming the world back to God's self.

Come and join us Saint Mark's Lutheran and invite your friends and family. Invite your coworkers and your mechanic, invite your neighbor and don't forget the stranger. Invite folks to see what is happening here at Saint Mark's, God is here and God is creating something anew. Congratulations confirmands, your journey has just started, come walk with us.
