He is Risen!

I grew up in a time when we heard "Show me" a lot. I was told that if you were from Missouri that this was your motto. We were taught to make sure that we had evidence from someone if they made some outrageous claim.

I remember that my dad did not follow this advice when he went to some outlet place and purchased a whole bag of socks for only \$1. Wow, he thought, what a deal and but when he came home and sorted them all out in pairs there was no matching set. He had gotten a great deal all right if he didn't mind walking around with a strange combination of socks.

I think we approach Easter in a similar way. We want proof; we want evidence that this really happened. What is interesting is that in Mark's account of the resurrection we have only 8 verses. Most scholars believe that this was all Mark wrote. Eight verses to "prove" that the once dead Jesus was alive! This doesn't seem to be much proof at all.

Over the years there has been a garment, a cloth that surfaces occasionally as the "proof" of the resurrection. It is called the Shroud of Turin. There are constant claims of this cloths authenticity.

I am not here to say either way. What I am here to say is that it seems that the proof of the resurrection is not in identifying the exact location and temperature of the tomb. It is not in the physical evidence of Jesus burial clothes. The proof of the resurrection for those early believers was in the way people were changed. How people who professed their faith in the risen Lord lived out their lives.

The proof of the resurrection today is how we now live out our lives transformed by the resurrection. How do we who are forgiven and embraced by God's new life act and react in a world that is seduced by things and thoughts that turn us inward?

We are Easter people and if that doesn't matter then Easter is reduced to another "Hallmark moment", celebrated but boxed up for another year.

We are Easter people who have been given another chance, a new way of living. We are Easter people whose eyes are opened to the incredible love of God who cannot accept death as the final answer.

We are Easter people who have been forgiven and each time we share that gift Easter happens again.

Self Bible Study for the Easter season

Easter is celebrated for 7 weeks. I am not sure many of us knew that before. For seven weeks we reflect on and ponder the wonder and surprise that Jesus is alive; that death is not the final answer and that we too have the power of new life.

During these weeks I would encourage each of us to take a second look at what we have become familiar to us in order to discover something new in the resurrection.

One method for self study is to read the story and then ask three questions. I learned this method while in Tanzania. I simply has the reader ask: Where is God in the story? Who am I in the story? And What is God asking of me in this story?

Each question may allow you to discover something that you had not known before or felt before. I would suggest that the second question lead you to consider various people in the story. How would you feel? How would you act or react? What would you be thinking?

Let the word of God speak to you in new ways.

The gospel lessons for the weeks of Easter in April are:

Mark 16: 1-8 - Go back to Galilee John 20:19-31 – Locked in a room. John 10:11-18 – Shepherd and sheep John 15: 1-8 – Vine and branches

"You did not choose Me, but I chose you."

John 15:16

We had just finished the branding. The cows were on the outside of the fenced holding corral. Their calves were creating quite a sound as they called for their mother. One thousand cows and their calves now being reunited after the branding of the calves. But how would they find each other? How would a calf know where its mother was, as the herd was spread over the open pasture?

We were given the assignment to station ourselves along the edge of the herd, and wait. The noise grew as calves and cows all met in the same field. The bellowing was intense, quick and anxious, cow calling and calf responding. Some calves gave up and wandered away. It was our job to push them back into the herd. Being lost causes confusion, and these calves stood frozen without much hope. The calves' cries that at first were strong and clear now turned to a mere whimper. The cows though continued to search and bellow out.

Moving about the herd the cows stretched their noses toward the sky and bellowed. There was no rest here. They were going to find their child. The reunion was amazing! Mother finally connecting with child, and the sound stopped as the licking began. Calf content and the cow secure in knowing that they found the one that was lost.

Some calves remained alone and disconnected. They seemed to have lost hope, and they finally laid down in exhaustion. The cows were relentless though, and they continued to bellow until all the lost were found.

I have always found this passage from John's Gospel intriguing. God choosing me, finding me, searching for me as I wander lost, confused and losing hope. How the bellowing of God must sound as God searches for all those who are lost. All of God's creation being called, being invited, being searched for by a God who bellows until all are found.

Is not this the action of the incarnation and the cross? God bellowing in his son, born into flesh, so that the search could go on in the world. God bellowing on the cross in the cries of the son, who had shown so much promise, and now the Father grieving in pain as the promise is crucified. Oh how God desires us to be his own, to be his children, to be joined to him forever. And God will not stop bellowing until all are found.

Gracious and loving God, you do not desire the death of your creation, but rather desire all to live. Oh how you search for us, calling so that we may hear, inviting so that we may receive, loving that we may live. Open our hearts and our ears and our minds so that we may know and live in your gift of love. Amen.
